## SUMMARY OF WORLD BROADCASTS — BBC MONITORING

The **Summary of World Broadcasts (SWB)**, published by BBC Monitoring provides a news and documentation service drawn from radio and TV broadcasts, news agency output and press material from some 130 countries. The SWB is divided into four parts:

1. The USSR

It highlights policy decisions and economic performance concerning **agriculture**, industry, energy, scientific developments, transport and communications, international trade, population growth, supply and distribution problems.
